Acute Water Shortage in DroughtHit Areas

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is awareof acute shortage of drinking water in manyparts of the country especially the droughthit areas and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Government hasidentified such regions and if so, the detailsthereof, State-wise; and
- (c) the action plan of the Government, if any for addressing these issues on priority?

ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE FORJAL SHAKTI (SHRI RATTAN LAL KATARIA)

(a) & (b) Water is a State subject. The identification of drought hit areas is done by States. After identification of such areas, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare is approached by States for financial assistance. According to Ministry of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmers' Welfare, details of States/ UTs which faced drought like situation in 2018-19, are as under:

(c) This Ministry supplements the efforts of State Governments for improving coverage of rural drinking water supply by providing technical and financial assistance through centrally sponsoredNational Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP). To take relief measures for restoration of the drinking water supply in drought affected areas, States may utilize up to 25% of NRDWP funds as Flexi funds, in case of Natural Calamity. States can also take a long term measures using NRDWP funds for providing permanent solution to the drinking water problem in such areas.
