**INCREASE IN STEEL IMPORT**

2304. DR. SHASHI THAROOR:

Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the imports of steel from Japan and South Korea have increased since 2014;
- (b) if so, the details of percentage-wise increase in steel import since 2014, country-wise and year-wise;
- (c) whether the import of steel by the Railways has increased since 2014 and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) whether it is a fact that the National Steel Policy requires Government projects to use steel manufactured in the country itself and if so, the details thereof?

**ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF STEEL

(SHRI DHARMENDRA PRADHAN)

(a) From FY 2013-14 till 2018-19, imports of steel from South Korea have increased by 122% while steel imports from Japan have declined by 4%.

(b) Data on percentage change in imports of total finished steel (alloy/stainless + non-alloy) by India from Japan and South Korea during last five years and April-May 2019 is given below:-
