HUMAN TRAFFICKING CASES

2688. SHRI G.M. SIDDESHWAR:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether cases of human trafficking and forced labour including trafficking of women and children are increasing;

(b) if so, the number of such cases reported and women/children rescued and provided rehabilitation during each of the last three years and the current year, State/ UT-wise;

(c) the measures to rehabilitate trafficked children and women who landed up in brothels or are trapped into modern day slavery;

(d) whether the Government proposes to bring radical change in administrative mechanism to effectively deal with such crimes along with other measures to check incidents of human trafficking and forced labour in the country; and

(e) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI G. KISHAN REDDY)

(a) to (d): National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) compiles and publishes statistics on crimes in its publication "Crime in India". Published reports are available till the year 2016. As per the latest data published by NCRB, State/UT wise number of cases of human trafficking reported, which includes cases of forced labour, during the period from 2014 to 2016 are at Annexure-I. Details of gender and age wise victims of trafficking rescued during the period from 2014 to 2016 are given in Annex-II to IV respectively. Data on women and children rehabilitated is not maintained centrally.

'Police' is a State subject under the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India and as such prevention of the crime of human trafficking and crime against children is the responsibility of State Governments. However, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has been supplementing the efforts of the State Governments by taking various initiatives and MHA has provided financial assistance to all States for measures. setting up Anti Human Trafficking Units and 332 Anti Human Trafficking Units have been set up in various Districts of the States. MHA also provides financial assistance to the States and Judicial Academies in States to hold 'Judicial Colloquiums' and 'State level conferences' to sensitize police officials, judicial officers and prosecutors about various provisions of law relevant to trafficking and their role in curbing trafficking. Meetings of Nodal Officers of Anti Human Trafficking Units of States & UTs are also convened on periodic basis to sensitize them on human trafficking issues. MHA has also issued various advisories to the

States and UTs from time to time on preventing and combating human trafficking. These advisories are available at MHA's website: www.mha.gov.in.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development implements 'Ujjawala' Scheme for Prevention of Trafficking and Rescue, Rehabilitation and Re-integration of Victims of Trafficking for Commercial Sexual Exploitation. The Target groups and beneficiaries of the scheme are women who are vulnerable to trafficking and who are the victims of trafficking. As on date, 267 projects including 133 Rehabilitation Homes are functioning in the country under Ujjawala Scheme and the number of beneficiaries is 5,208. Protective and Rehabilitative Homes have been set up under the Ujjawala Scheme where basic amenities such as food, clothing, medical care, legal aid, vocational training and education to the rescued victims are provided as a rehabilitation component. Grant is released to States and UTs for implementing the Ujjawala Scheme.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development is also implementing the Child Protection Services Scheme in partnership with States/Union Territories for providing institutional and non-institutional care through service delivery structures as mandated under the Juvenile Justice (Care and protection of Children) Act, 2015. Under the scheme, approximately

75,000 children including trafficked children who have been rescued are being supported in approximately 2000 Child Care Institutions.

In order to assist the State Governments in the task of rehabilitation of identified and released bonded labourers, a Centrally Sponsored Plan Scheme of Ministry of Labour and Employment for Rehabilitation of Bonded Labour is in operation. The Government has revamped the Centrally Sponsored Plan Scheme with effect from 17th May, 2016. Under this scheme, financial assistance is provided for rehabilitation of a rescued bonded labourer. The financial assistance for rehabilitation is 100% reimbursed by the Central Government.
