- (a) to (c): No, Sir. The Indian Army has a well established recruitment process for which no change is envisaged. The induction of women is based on the organisational requirement and functional needs of the Army. Women are inducted as Officers in the Indian Army through Short Service Commission on all India merit basis. Recently, Government has decided to enroll women Soldiers General Duty (below Officers rank) in Corps of Military Police (CMP) in a phased manner.
