**ONGOING/PENDING PROJECTS OF NHs**

3095. SHRI SUSHIL KUMAR SINGH:

Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of ongoing/pending projects of National Highways (NHs) in the country particularly in Bihar;
- (b) the amount sanctioned and released by the Government to implement each of these projects in the country during the last three years and the current year;
- (c) the steps being taken by the Government to complete these projects in the country particularly in Bihar within a stipulated time period;
- (d) whether the Government has received any representations from public representatives regarding various anomalies in National Highway projects in the country particularly in Bihar during the said period; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the steps being taken by the Government thereon?

**ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

(SHRI NITIN JAIRAM GADKARI)

- (a) There are 1682 number of ongoing / pending projects of National Highways in the country. Out of these, 86 number of ongoing / pending projects are particularly in Bihar.
- (b) The amounts allocated and released to complete these projects in the country during last 3 years and current year are as follows :-

- (c) The monthly, quarterly, annually periodical review meetings are being taken up by the Government at various levels to complete these projects in the country particularly in Bihar within a stipulated time period.
- (d) & (e) There is no such representations received on anomalies. However, the representations of suggestive nature have been received and feasible suggestions have been taken care of during implementation.
