#### SHORTAGE OF AYUSH DOCTORS

#### 3206. SHRI SHIVAKUMAR C. UDASI:

# Will the Minister of AYURVEDA, YOGA AND NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (AYUSH) be pleased to state:

(a) whether the large number of posts of Ayush doctors/practitioners including Homoeopathy and Unani are lying vacant in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether there is a shortage of Ayush drug inspectors in the country and if so, the details thereof, stream and State/UT-wise; and

(d) the steps being taken by the Government to fill these vacancies along with the time by which these vacancies are likely to be filled?

### ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYURVEDA, YOGA & NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK)

(a) to (d): As Public Health is a State subject, the primary responsibility to fill up the posts of AYUSH doctors/practitioners including Homoeopathy & Unani and AYUSH drug inspectors and maintaining their status comes under the purview of respective State/UT Government. However, under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National AYUSH Mission (NAM), the components for setting up of upto 50 bedded integrated AYUSH hospitals and upgradation of exclusive standalone State Government AYUSH Hospitals *inter-alia* are having provision for contractual deployment of AYUSH doctors. In this regard, State/UT Governments are required to submit their proposals through State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) as per the guidelines of the scheme.
