Will the Minister of TRIBAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to make special provision in the next plan for the tribal dominated areas in the State of Chhattisgarh; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof including the proposed increase in the annual plan?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TRIBAL AFFAIRS (Smt. RENUKA SINGH SARUTA)

(a)& (b): Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MoTA) has identified 19 priority Districts where tribal population is more than 25% including LWE affected Districts to focus on overall development (**Annexure 1**). NITI Aayog has also included the following 10 tribal dominated Districts of Chhattisgarh in the list of Aspirational Districts for spearheading the development process in these areas:

Besides, Ministry of Home Affairs has put in place a National Policy and Action Plan to address Left Wing Extremism (LWE) problems that envisages a multi-pronged strategy involving security related measures, developmental interventions, ensuring rights & entitlements of local communities etc. Details of LWE affected Districts of Chhattisgarh including tribal dominated Districts are as under:

Funds earmarkedby the Central Government for development across the country including that of Chhattisgarh under various schemes Central Ministries including MoTA for the year 2019-20 have increased to Rs. 51283.53 crore from Rs. 37533.14 crore during 2018-19, which is about 37% more than the last financial year.

Government has adopted multi-pronged strategy for overall development of tribal people and tribal dominated areas across the country including Chhattisgarh which includes the following:

- (i) As per the extant provisions, States including Chhattisgarh has to earmarked funds for tribal development from the total plan outlays of the State not less than the population proportion of STs in State as per 2011 Census and in tune with problem share of the ST population.
- (ii) Central Ministries earmark funds for tribal development as per the prescribed percentage out of their total scheme allocation.

- (iv) Ministry of tribal Affairs (MoTA) under its scheme under 'Special Central Assistance to Tribal Sub-Scheme (SCA to TSS)' and Grants under Article 275(1) of the Constitution provides funds to the State Governments including Chhattisgarh. Share of allocation to the States under these scheme / Grants is determined in the proportion of (a) 2/3rd based on tribal population and (b) 1/3rd based on tribal dominated areas.
- (iv) MoTA is running a flagship scheme of 'Eklavya Model Residential School (EMRSs)' wherein it is intended to set up 33 EMRSs by 2022 in tribal dominated Blocks where actual tribal population of 20000 constituting at least 50% of the total population in the Block. List as at **Annexure 2**. Besides 42 EMRSs has already been sanctioned to the State of Chhattisgarh. Status of existing EMRSs in the State of Chhattisgarh is as under:

- (v) Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India (TRIFED) functioning under the administrative control of MoTA envisages to set up Vandhan Kendras in tribal dominated areas including those of Chhattisgarh to primarily cater to the training and development of value chain of Minor Forest Produce.
- (vi) Under Pre-matric and Post Matric Scholarship schemes of MoTA, funds are given to the beneficiaries based on demand through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode.
- (vii) Under the provisions of Forest Rights Act, 2006, MoTA recognizes and vests the forest rights and occupation in forest land in forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes and other traditional forest dwellers who have been residing in such forests for generations but whose right could not be recorded. As per the information received from State Government of Chhattisgarh upto 31.03.2019, under FRA 8,90,240 claims have been filed and 4,23,218 titles have been distributed to the extent of 28,81,246.84 acres of forest land.
