- (c)if so, the details thereof and the reaction of the Government thereto;
- (d)the details of the efforts being made by the Government to provide medical facilities to the beedi workers at their workplace; and
- (e)the details of the meeting of Central Advisory Committee to pay attention to matters relating to beedi workers during the last three years and action taken by the Government thereon?

## II. REVISED INTEGRATED HOUSING SCHEME (RIHS), 2016:

Revised Integrated Housing Scheme (RIHS), 2016 for Beedi Workers is being implemented in the country through office of 17 Welfare Commissioners of the Labour Welfare Organisation of the Ministry. The housing subsidy of Rs. 1,50,000/- is disbursed in three installments in the ratio of 25:60:15.

#### III. HEALTH SCHEME:

Besides providing health care facilities through 12 Hospitals and 286 Dispensaries across the country following assistance is given to certain categories of diseases:-

## IV. TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT OF BEEDI WORKS

Ministry of Labour & Employment has initiated action for skill development the Beedi workers to provide alternate source of employment for viable alternative sources of livelihood.

Health care facilities are provided to beed workers and their families though 12 hospitals and 286 dispensaries.

(e): With the implementation of GST and introduction of Finance Bill 2016, the cess collected for running the welfare schemes have been abolished or subsumed in the GST.

The role of Beedi Workers Welfare Fund, under the Beedi Workers Welfare Fund Act to advise the Government on fund related matters are no longer supported as these Funds have been repealed or under the process of repeal.

However a meeting of the Central Advisory Committee on Beedi Workers Welfare Fund was held in the year 2017 and the suggestions given by this committee has been adhered to.
