INFLUX OF TOURISTS

3614. SHRI HANS RAJ HANS: SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV:

Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether inflow of foreign tourists has not been steadily increasing due to consistent declination of tourism sector;
- (b) if so, the number of foreign tourist who visited India during the last three years;
- (c) whether the Government has taken any steps to improve the infrastructure of the places of tourist interest in order to attract more number of foreign tourists; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TOURISM (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) (SHRI PRAHLAD SINGH PATEL)

- (a) and (b): No, Sir. The Foreign Tourist Arrivals in India during 2016, 2017 and 2018 were 8.80 million, 10.04 million and 10.56 million (provisional) respectively.
- (c) and (d): Development and promotion of tourist places is primarily the responsibility of concerned State Government/UT Administration. However, Ministry of Tourism, Government of India has taken several steps for creation of tourism infrastructure in the country so as to attract more tourists, which inter-alia include:
 - i. Launched two flagship schemes: Swadesh Darshan Integrated Development of Theme-Based Tourist Circuits and PRASHAD- Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual,

Heritage Augmentation Drive. The projects under these schemes are identified for development in consultation with the State Governments /UT Administrations and are sanctioned subject to availability of funds, submission of suitable detailed project reports, adherence to scheme guidelines and utilization of funds released earlier.

- ii. Pursuant to the Budget Announcements of 2018-19, this Ministry has identified 17 sites in 12 clusters in the country for development as Iconic Tourist Sites.
- iii. The 'Adopt A Heritage: Apni Dharohar, Apni Pehchaan', a collaborative effort by Ministry of Tourism, Ministry of Culture and Archaeological Survey of India (ASI), State/UTs Governments, envisages developing heritage sites and making them tourist friendly, to enhance tourism potential and cultural importance in a planned and phased manner.
- iv. Ministry provides Assistance to Central Agencies for the development of tourism related infrastructure in the country.
