3829. MS. RAMYA HARIDAS:

Will the Minister of SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that only 1.4 per cent of India's GDP is spent on social security schemes and it is lower than the spendings in most countries in Asia;
- (b) if so, the details of the steps the Government would take to increase the percentage of expenditure on social security schemes; and
- (c) the allocations made and expenditure incurred towards social security schemes during the last five years, scheme and year-wise?

(a) to (c): The Government has a priority to empower weaker sections of the society through implementation of social security schemes.
