- a) the schemes likely to be formulated by the Government for the development of animal husbandry in Rajasthan as besides agriculture animal husbandry sector is also a good source of income for farmers;

- c) whether the Government has any plan to promote dairy industry and if so, the details thereof;
- d) whether there is any scheme in place to help farmers during the non-productive period of cows and buffaloes; and

(a) to (e) In order to complement and supplement the efforts of the States/UTs for development of animal husbandry sector, the Government is implementing various schemes across the country including Rajasthan namely;

- I. Rashtriya Gokul Mission,
- II. National Programme for Dairy Development,
- III. National Dairy Plan-I,
- IV. Dairy Entrepreneurship Development Scheme
- V. Dairy Processing and Infrastructure Development Fund,
- VI. Supporting Dairy Cooperatives and Farmer Producer Organizations engaged in dairy activities
- VII. National Livestock Mission,
- VIII. Livestock Health and Disease Control

Apart from this, the Government has formulated a National Action Plan for Dairy Development with following objectives –

- To increase the national milk production from 163.7 MMT in 2016-17 to 254.55 MMT by 2021-22 for meeting the increasing milk demand by domestic milk production and also ensuring nutritional security at household level
- To double milk producers' income at farm level by 2021-22 by providing rural milk producers with greater access to the organised milk processing sector
