SHRI KIRTI VARDHAN SINGH:

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Chandrayaan-II mission;
- (b) the time by which this mission would take-off for the journey;
- (c) the manoeuvres worked out for the soft landing of spacecraft on Moon; and
- (d) the communication and photo images planned during the sojourn?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PG & PENSIONS AND IN THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE (DR. JITENDRA SINGH):

- (a) Chandrayaan-2 Mission is the second lunar mission from ISRO. The prime objective is the demonstration of soft landing on moon. The mission consists of Orbiter, Lander (named Vikram) and Rover (named Pragyan).
- (b) Chandrayaan-2 Mission was planned to be launched on 15th July 2019. However, due to technical snag observed in launch vehicle system, Chandrayaan-II launch was postponed. The revised launch date will be announced later once decided.

- All the required manoeuvres and mission management strategy has been worked out for the soft landing of the spacecraft on Moon. The same have been reviewed and finalized.
- (d) The communication links and networks have been planned for the sojourn. The photo images are planned to be taken after reaching the Moon orbit and after landing.
