**SHARE OF SMALL SCALE INDUSTRIES IN EXPORTS**

4261. SHRI AJAY NISHAD:

Will the Minister of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises be pleased to state:

- (a) the share of small scale industries in exports in comparison to the organized sector;
- (b) the contribution of the small scale industries in generation of income and employment opportunities; and
- (c) the long term scheme chalked out by the Government for the development of small scale industries?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (c): As per the information received from the Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics, the Share of MSME related Products in total Export from India during 2017-18 and 2018-19 are 48.56% and 48.10%, respectively (figure for 2018-19 are provisional and subject to change).

As per the information received from Central Statistics Office, Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation, share of MSME Gross Value Added (GVA) in All India Gross Domestic Product (GDP) during 2016-17 was 28.9%.

As per the 73<sup>rd</sup> Round of National Sample Survey (NSS), conducted by National Sample Survey Office, Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation during the period 2015-16, the estimated number of workers in unincorporated non-agriculture MSMEs in the country engaged in different economic activities excluding the MSMEs registered under (a) Sections 2m (i) and 2m (ii) of the Factories Act, 1948, (b) Companies Act, 1956 and (c) Construction activities falling under Section F of National Industrial Classification (NIC), 2008, are 11.10 Crore.

The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises implements various schemes and programmes to boost the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) Sector throughout the country. These include the schemes/programmes such as Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI), A Scheme for Promoting Innovation, Rural Industry and Entrepreneurship (ASPIRE), Credit Guarantee Scheme (CGTMSE), Credit linked Capital Subsidy-Technology Upgradation Scheme (CLCS-TUS), National Manufacturing Competitiveness Programme (NMCP), Micro & Small Enterprises- Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP), National Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Hub (NSSH), Procurement and Marketing Schemes (PMS) etc. National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) under the Ministry of MSME also boost and supports Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) Sector by providing integrated support services encompassing marketing, finance, technology and other services.
