Illegal Trees Cutting and Poaching of Wild Animals

4489. SHRI BALUBHAU ALIAS SURESH NARAYAN DHANORKAR:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware of large scale illegal cutting of trees and poaching of wild animals in Tadoba Tiger reserve;
- (b) if so, the details of such incidents reported in the last one year and the number of people arrested in such cases;
- (c) whether the Government plans to make stringent rules to stop illegal cutting of trees and poaching; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE (SHRI BABUL SUPRIYO)

- (a) & (b) As per information received from the State, no large scale illicit felling or poaching has been reported from the Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve. Due to adequate protection measures, 31 people have been arrested for incidents of illegal felling amounting to 56 cubic meters besides 8 poaching cases including 2 tigers during the last one year.
- (c) & (d) Illegal felling and poaching are being adequately addressed by stringent provisions of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 as amended in 2006 and the Indian Forest Act, 1927.
