Contamination of Water in Bihar

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether drinking water has been found contaminated with arsenic and fluoride in many areas of certain districts of Bihar;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of effects on health on drinking of such contaminated water; and
- (d) the measures being taken and plans being contemplated by the Government to provide clean drinking water and to make people aware about prevention from these diseases?

ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI RATTAN LAL KATARIA)

- (a) & (b) Yes Sir, as reported by Government of Bihar in the Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) of this Ministry, the district-wise number of arsenic and fluoride affected habitations isplaced at **Annexure**.
- (c)Fluorosis, a public health problem, is caused by excess intake of fluorides through drinkingwater/food products/industrial pollutants, over a prolonged period. It causes severe healthrelated disorders such as dental fluorosis, skeletal fluorosis and non-skeletal fluorosis. Arsenic is a carcinogenic element and is associated with skin, lung, bladder, kidney, and livercancer. Dermatological, developmental, neurological, respiratory, cardiovascular, immunological, and endocrine effects are also evident.
- (d)Drinking water supply is a State subject. For improving the coverage of safe drinkingwater to rural population, this Ministry supplements the efforts of the States byproviding them with technical and financial assistance through the centrally sponsoredscheme National Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP). It is the StateGovernments who plan, design, approve, execute, operate & maintain the schemes forproviding safe drinking water to rural population. The funds provided to the States under NRDWP can be utilized for taking up schemes in water quality affected areas on priority including arsenic/fluoride affected areas.

During March 2016, with the recommendation of NITI Aayog, an amount of Rs. 1000Crores was released to various Arsenic & Fluoride affected States/UTs for installation of Communitywater purification plants. An amount of Rs. 22.83 Cr.was provided to Bihar.

In addition to this, this Ministry had launchedtheNational Water Quality Sub-Mission (NWQSM) on 22ndMarch 2017 under NRDWPtoprovide safe drinking water to 27,544 Arsenic / Fluoride affected rural habitationsinthecountry. An amount of Rs. 171.96 Cr. has been released to Bihar so far.

Moreover, States can utilize upto 5% of National Rural Drinking Water Programme funds for Support Activities which inter alia includes Information, Education and Communication (IEC) of Rural Drinking Water Supply as per NRDWP guidelines.
