(a) and (b): Yes, Sir. Indian Railways' All India Railway Helpline - 139 is available for lodging grievances and enquiries including complaints for assault with passengers during travel by train. In addition to 139, for any emergency grievances related to security, safety, and medical assistance Ministry of Home Affairs' National Emergency Response Support System 112 (ERSS-112) can also be accessed.

The helpline 139 is available round the clock in 12 languages namely - Hindi, English, Punjabi, Bengali, Assamese, Oriya, Marathi, Gujarati, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, and Kannada.
