DISBURSAL OF VANDE BHARAT EXPRESS TRAIN IN KERALA

1167. SHRI KUMBAKUDI SUDHAKARAN: SHRI K. MURALEEDHARAN: ADV. ADOOR PRAKASH:

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government has finalised the disbursal of Vande Bharat Express train for the State of Kerala;

(b) if so, the exact timeline required for the launch of the service in Kerala and if not, the reasons therefor;

(c) the details of the routes, fare and capacity decided in this regard;

(d) the maximum speed that can be attained by the train in Kerala, which has a number of curves in its rail tracks;

(e) whether the Government has any plans to introduce more High Speed and Semi-High Speed trains under the Vande Bharat Scheme and if so, the details thereof; and

(f) the need for K-Rail, a high-speed train service planned by the State Government, when the Vande Bharat express is able to attain high speed and cover long distances in a short time?

(a) to (d) Indian Railways (IR) do not run trains, including Vande Bharat train services, on state-wise basis as Railway network straddle across state boundaries. However, introduction of new Vande Bharat services is an on-going process which is dependent on factors like operational feasibility and availability of rolling stock, etc. The Vande Bharat trains presently running over the IR network are Semi-High speed train services, which are being operated using the ultra-modern train sets and *inter alia* have modern features like quick acceleration. The point-topoint fare of these trains depends, *inter alia* on the distance between the stations and are being operated with a composition of 16 coaches.

(e) Of the 504 Vande Bharat Rakes sanctioned for induction, IR Production units will manufacture 102 rakes during the period 2022-24. Tenders have also been floated for engagement of technological partner(s) for manufacturing 400 Energy Efficient Vande Bharat Rakes, as announced in Railway Budget 2022-23.

(f) At present, no High Speed Rail Corridor is sanctioned in the State of Kerala. However, Kerala Rail Development Corporation Ltd. (KRDCL), a Joint Venture Company of State Government of Kerala (51%) and Ministry of Railways (49%), has taken up the work of Silver Line (Semi High Speed Rail) from Thiruvananthapuram to Kasaragod (530.6 Km) for development.

As of now, Railway Board has granted only, In Principle Approval (IPA) for this project, which connects the Northern part to the Southern part (Kasaragod to Thiruvananthapuram) of Kerala.

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
