## 1379. SHRIMATI SANGEETA KUMARI SINGH DEO: DR. JAYANTA KUMAR ROY:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES वस्त्र मंत्री be pleased to state :

(a) the total number of textile training centres which have been registered and made operational across the country under the Samarth Scheme in the last three years, State and year-wise;

(b) the number of persons skilled by imparting training after the launch of Samarth Scheme across the country in the last three years, State/ UT-wise;

(c) whether the Government has conducted any assessment to understand the impact of the skill training activities on textile industry and if so, the details thereof;

(d) the manner in which the scheme has been beneficial in terms of employment, earning foreign exchange and well-being of the people engaged thereon; and

(e) the further steps being taken by the Government for the development of handloom and textile sector?

# ANSWER वस्त्र राज्य मंत्री (**श्रीमती दर्शना जरदोश**) THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR TEXTILES (SMT. DARSHANA JARDOSH)

(a): Details of textile training centres registered and made operational across the country under the Samarth Scheme in the last three years, State/UT-wise and year-wise are given in Annexure-I.

(b): State/UT-wise details of beneficiaries trained under Samarth Scheme in the last three years is given in Annexure-II.

(c): An evaluation of the impact of previous version of skilling scheme in textile sector (Integrated Skill Development Scheme) was carried out in 2017-18 and the recommendations of the study were utilized while formulating the ongoing scheme i.e. Samarth.

(d): Samarth- Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector (SCBTS) has been formulated with a provision for sustainable livelihood either by wage or self employment to all the sections of the society. The scheme provides demand driven, placement oriented National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) compliant skilling programme to supplement the efforts of the industry in creating jobs in the organized textile and related sectors, covering the entire value chain of textiles, excluding Spinning and Weaving. As per scheme guidelines, Implementing Partners are mandated to provide placement to 70% and 90% of trained beneficiaries under entry level course and upskilling courses respectively for the courses in organised sector. The scheme also addresses the skilling and skill upgradation requirements in the traditional sectors of Handlooms, Handicrafts, Sericulture and Jute, with the provision of self-employment.

(e): Government is implementing various schemes for the development of handloom sector viz, National Handloom Development Programme and Raw Material Supply Scheme and schemes such as Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme, PradhanMantri Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel(PM MITRA), SAMARTH (Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector), Silk Samagra, National Handicraft Development Programme, Integrated Wool Development Programme (IWDP), National Technical Textile Mission (NTTM), Scheme for Integrated Textile Parks (SITP) etc. catering exclusively for development of textile sector in the country.
