MSMEs IN HARYANA

1433. SHRI DHARAMBIR SINGH:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the number and details of applications received for setting up of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) to boost the employment in Haryana and the number of applications on which action has been taken during the last five years;
- (b) the number of industries which have been given loan/subsidy; and
- (c) the details of schemes being run by the Government to promote the MSMEs?

ANSWER

(a): The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) does not set up MSMEs in any State. The MSME sector consists of private players and investments in this sector are made by the entrepreneurs themselves. Promotion and development of enterprises is a State subject. The Central Government supplements the efforts of the State/UT Governments through various schemes, programmes and policy initiatives for promotion and development of MSMEs in the country, including Haryana.

However, the Ministry of MSME has launched UDYAM Registration Portal w.e.f. 01.07.2020 pursuant to the revision of MSME Definition and MSMEs may register themselves on voluntarily basis. As on 09.12.2022, the number of MSMEs which are setup during last five years (2017-18 to 2021-22) and registered on Udyam Portal in the state of Haryana was 2,52,279.

(b): Under the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), the number of units to which margin money subsidy was given in the state of Haryana is as follows:

(c): Ministry of MSME implements various schemes/programmes for the promotion and development of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) sector across the country which inter alia include Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Micro and Small Enterprises-Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP), Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI), Credit Guarantee Scheme for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE) and A Scheme for Promoting Innovation, Rural Industry & Entrepreneurship (ASPIRE).

The Government has taken a number of recent initiatives to support MSMEs in the country, which inter alia include:

- (i) Rs. 5 lakh crore Collateral Free Automatic Loans for business, including MSMEs.
- (ii) Rs. 50,000 crore equity infusion through MSME Self-Reliant India Fund.
- (iii) New revised criteria for classification of MSMEs.
- (iv) No global tenders for procurement up to Rs. 200 crores.
- (v) "Udyam Registration" for MSMEs, for Ease of Doing Business.
- (vi) Launching of an online Portal "Champions" in June, 2020 to cover many aspects of e-governance including grievance redress and handholding of MSMEs.
- (vii) Inclusion of Retail and Wholesale trades as MSMEs w.e.f. 02nd July, 2021.
- (viii) Non-tax benefits extended for 3 years in case of an upward change in status of MSMEs.
