Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- a. the number of hostels for working women being run by the Government, State-wise;
- b. the number of proposals received and sanctioned by the Government for construction of working women hostels in Andhra Pradesh;
- c. the details of hostels constructed under 'Working Women Hostel Scheme' during the last three years in the said State indicating the funds allocated and spend thereon;
- d. the total capacity of hostels along with the vacancies in these hostels, district-wise; and
- e. the steps taken to ensure proper maintenance and upkeep of these hostels?

ANSWER

- (a) The details of Sakhi Niwas (erstwhile working women hostels) functioning in the States/UTs-wise, is at Annexure-I.
- (b) In the current financial year 2022-23 (up till December, 2022), no new proposal has been received from the State Government of Andhra Pradesh.
- (c) As informed by the State Government of Andhra Pradesh, the construction work of one Working Women Hostel located at Guntur has been completed in the year 2020-21 (due to Covid-Pandemic and other local issues) which was sanctioned by Central Government during the year 2015-16. The Government of India share of Rs.170.25 lakhs received was utilized for the purpose.

(d) The total capacity of hostels along with the vacancies in the hostels of Andhra Pradesh, district-wise is at Annexure-II.

(e) Under Mission Shakti guidelines, Hostel Management Committees have been envisaged for day to day monitoring and management of the matters related to functioning of Working Women Hostel.
