(a) As per the latest available estimates from National Health Accounts Estimates (NHA) Report 2018-19, the State/UT-wise per capita government health expenditure is given below:

(b): As per information provided by National Medical Commission (NMC), there are 13,08,009 allopathic doctors registered with the State Medical Councils and the National Medical Commission (NMC) as on June, 2022. Assuming $80 \%$ availability of registered allopathic doctors and 5.65 lakh AYUSH doctors, the doctor-population ratio in the country is 1:834 per thousand population.

As per Indian Nursing Council (INC), there are around 35.14 lakh nursing personnel registered in the country as on $31^{\text {st }}$ December, 2021. Assuming $80 \%$ nursing personnel are active in the country, it is estimated that around 28.11 lakh are available in the country. Assuming the population of the country to be Rs 136 crore, the nurse to Population ratio comes out to be 2.06 nurses per 1000 population.
