DEVELOPMENT OF CHILDREN IN NORTH-EASTERN STATES

1839: SHRI KRIPANATH MALLAH:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the initiatives taken by the Ministry and its ancillary bodies for overall development of children in North-Eastern States including Assam;
- (b) the details of the funds sanctioned, allocated and utilised for these initiatives during the last three years within Assam; and
- (c) the details of the target set and achievements made so far along with its r esponse within Assam?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

(a) to (c) The Government has recently approved `Mission Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 realigning the existing schemes of Anganwadi Services, Poshan 2.0 and Scheme for Adolescent Girls. The important components of Mission Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 are as under:

- Nutrition Support for POSHAN through Supplementary Nutrition Programme (SNP) for children of the age group of 06 months to 6 years, pregnant women and lactating mothers (PWLM); and for Adolescent Girls in the age group of 14 to 18 years in Aspirational Districts and North Eastern Region (NER);
- Early Childhood Care and Education [3-6 years]and early stimulation for (0-3 years);
- Anganwadi Infrastructure including modern, upgraded Saksham Anganwadi; and
- Poshan Abhiyaan

POSHAN Abhiyaan, a flagship scheme of the Government was launched in 2018 to address the malaise of malnutrition by adopting a synergised and result oriented approach. To ensure a holistic approach, all districts of States/UTs have been covered in the Abhiyaan which also includes the districts of North East region. The goals of POSHAN Abhiyaan are to achieve improvement in nutritional status of Children from 0-6 years, Adolescent Girls, Pregnant Women and Lactating Mothers, in a time bound manner with fixed targets.

The goals of POSHAN Abhiyaan are to achieve improvement in nutritional status of Children from 0-6 years, Adolescent Girls, Pregnant Women and Lactating Mothers, in a time bound manner with fixed targets as under:

Mission Poshan 2.0 seeks to address the challenges of malnutrition in children, adolescent girls, pregnant women and lactating mothers through a strategic shift in nutrition content and delivery and by creation of a convergent eco-system to develop and promote practices that nurture health, wellness and immunity. Steps have been taken to improve nutritional quality and testing in accredited labs, strengthen delivery and leverage technology under the 'Poshan Tracker', a robust ICT enabled platform to improve governance with regard to real time monitoring of provisioning of supplementary nutrition for prompt supervision and management of services.

One of the key planks of the program is behaviour change communication through Jan Andolan activities. At a national level, Poshan Maah is conducted every year in September and Poshan Pakhwada is conducted every year in March.. During Poshan Pakhwada 2022, over 15 thousand activities and during Poshan Maah 2022 close to 6 lakh Jan Andolan based activities were carried out in the state of Assam.

The details of funds allocated and utilised by the state of Assam under POSHAN Abhiyaan during the last three years are as under:

Further, out of 1,03,461 sanctioned Anganwadi centres for North-Eastern States, a total of 1,02,808 are operational in NE States including Assam. The total number of beneficiaries in the NE states under the scheme is 58,47,355 out of which 49,80,677 are children in the age group of 6 months to 6 years. The details of operational AWCs and the number of beneficiaries in respect of each of the NE States including Assam is given at **Annexure I**.

The funds allocated, released and utilized under Anganwadi Services in respect of Assam is placed at **Annexure II**.

The Ministry is implementing a centrally sponsored scheme namely Mission Vatsalya Scheme (erstwhile Child Protection Services (CPS) Scheme) under which support is provided to State and UT Governments including Assam for delivering services for children in need and in difficult circumstances universally across the country. The Child Care Institutions (CCIs) established under the scheme support inter-alia ageappropriate education, access to vocational training, recreation, health care, counselling etc. and covers both rural and urban children. Further, the Ministry regularly engages with all States/UTs and from time to time has shared various advisories and guidelines for continued and uninterrupted delivery of services and also for effective implementation of the scheme.
