2241. SHRI. NATARAJAN P.R.:

Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government is having any comparative list of countries which have won medals in “Tokyo Olympic” in the recent past;

(b) if so, the details thereof, Athletics/and game-wise;

(c) whether the Government felt any need for exposure of Indians to sports at the elementary school level; and

(d) if so, the action taken/being taken to improve the professional engagement in sports and increase the medal tally in the Olympics and Asian Games?

(a) & (b): The comparative list of medals won by various countries at Tokyo Olympics 2020 is given in the statement at Annexure-I. Details of medals won sports discipline-wise and sportsperson-wise at Tokyo Olympics are available at website <https://olympics.com/en/olympic-games/tokyo-2020/results>.

(c) & (d): Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports is providing financial assistance to recognized National Sports Federations (NSFs) towards the training of athletes, which includes all requisite support for their preparations, such as Foreign Coaches/supporting staff, scientific & medical support besides financial assistance for their training abroad and participation in international competitions in India and abroad through the Scheme of Assistance to NSFs. For the said purpose, an ACTC (Annual Calendar for Training and Competition) budget is approved for each NSF every year.

Further, elite athletes who are medal prospects at mega-sports events, including Olympic Games, are supported in a customized mode under Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS).

Sports Authority of India (SAI), an autonomous body under the administrative control of the Ministry, is implementing the following Sports Promotional Schemes across the country to identify talented sportspersons in various age groups and nurture them to excel at national and international levels:

- National Centres of Excellence (NCOE)**
- SAI Training Centre (STC)**
- Extension Centre of STC**
- National Sports Talent Contest (NSTC)**
(its Sub-Schemes - Regular Schools, IGMA & Akharas)

The selected athletes are supported through expert coaches, sports equipment, Scientific support, boarding and lodging, sports kit, competition exposure, educational expenses, medical/ insurance, and stipend as per the approved scheme norms.

The government has launched Khelo India Programme with twin objectives of mass participation and the promotion of excellence in sports. Various programmes have been established under this scheme to promote sports and improve the level of sports and infrastructural facilities, including stadiums, playing fields, tracks, and sports training in the country at the school level. Under this scheme, various

initiatives have been undertaken to encourage sportspersons at various levels, including those in schools.

So far, under Khelo India Scheme, 733 Khelo India Centres, 29 Khelo India State Centres of Excellence and 266 Academies have been sanctioned across the country.
