## Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION लागर विमालल मंत्री

be pleased to state:-

(a) whether the Government proposes to increase employment opportunity for 100,000 people by 2024 including an additional requirement of 10,000 pilots by 2030 and if so, the details thereof;

(b) whether 296 pilots were recruited against 862 commercial pilot licenses issued in 2021 and if so, the details thereof;

(c) the details of employment opportunities generated and Commercial Pilot Licenses (CPL) issued during 2021-22; and

(d) whether the Government has any data on the employment of pilots who obtained CPL and if so, the details thereof?

#### ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION लागर विमालल मंत्रालय में राज्य मंत्री (GEN. (DR) V. K. SINGH (RETD))

(a) Post Covid, the air traffic across the globe including India is increasing. The requirement of pilots is likely to go up. As per Industry projections there may be a need for 1000 pilots per annum in India over next five years.

At present, there are 34 Flying Training Organisations (FTOs) operating at 52 bases as approved by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA).

(b) to (d) As per the data received from airlines, 248 pilots were recruited by various Scheduled operators in 2021

Total number of Commercial Pilots Licenses issued by Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) during 2021-22 is as below:-
