**SAFE AND CLEAN DRINKING WATER UNDER JJM**

†2695: SHRI VIVEK NARAYAN SHEJWALKAR:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the objectives achieved with regard to the number of rural households provided safe and clean drinking water through taps under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM); and
- (b) the number of households in Madhya Pradesh provided clean drinking water under the mission so far, district-wise especially in Gwalior district?

**ANSWER**

(a) Government of India is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) – Har Ghar Jal in partnership with States/ UTs, with the objective to enable every rural household to have potable tap water supply in adequate quantity at a service level of 55 litre per capita per day (lpcd), of prescribed quality (BIS:10500) and on regular and long-term basis, by 2024.

At the time of announcement of Jal Jeevan Mission, 3.23 Crore rural households (17%) were reported to have tap water connections. Since the launch of JJM on 15.08.2019, 7.53 Crore rural households have been provided potable tap water supply. As on 20.12.2022, out of 19.36 Crore rural households, 10.77 Crore rural households (56%) are reported to have potable tap water supply.

(b) As reported by State Government of Madhya Pradesh, 41.78 lakh rural households have been provided potable tap water supply since the launch of JJM. As on 20.12.2022, out of 120.07 lakh rural households 55.31 lakh rural households (46%) are reported to have potable tap water supply in Madhya Pradesh.

In Gwalior district, so far 0.45 lakh rural households have been provided potable tap water supply under the mission. As on 20.12.2022, out of 1.27 lakh rural households in Gwalior district, 0.64 lakh (50%) rural households have access to potable tap water supply. The district wise details are **annexed**.
