FUNDS FOR HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the funds allocated for increasing the infrastructure of the health sector in each State/UT under PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission for the FY 2021-22, 2022-23;
- (b) the details of the funds allocated to Kerala under the said Scheme;
- (c) whether funds have been allocated for increasing infrastructure in Manjeri Medical College in the Malappuram Lok Sabha constituency under the said Scheme and if so, the details of the progress of the said project;
- (d) the details of the institutions/States/UTs selected to implement projects through PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (CS component); and
- (e) the details of the projects which are being implemented under the scheme along with the funds earmarked of the same?

- (a) to (e)
 - The government has launched the PM-Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) to strengthen the public health infrastructure by leveraging existing reforms undertaken over the last fifteen years. Under PM-ABHIM, an amount of Rs. 584.04 crore has been released to the States/UTs (including Kerala) in the FY 2021-22 and allocation has been made for Rs 4167.84 in the FY 2022-23 to strengthen the public health infrastructure. The State/UT wise details of allocation and release is at annexure – I.

- The State of Kerala has been accorded approval for establishment of 50 bedded Critical Care Block (CCB) in Manjeri Medical College during FY 2022-23 with an outlay of Rs 23.75 Crore under PM-ABHIM.
- Under the CSS components of the scheme, provision has been made for the establishment of 730 District Integrated Public Health Labs in the country, wherein each district will have one such lab. All the Districts with more than 5 Lakhs population will have 50 to100 bedded Critical Care Hospital Blocks and remaining districts will have Referral linkages. 3382 Block Public Health Units (BPHUs) at the block level, Construction of 17,788 Building less Sub-Centres as Ayushman Bharat- Health & Wellness centres and 11,024 Health & wellness Centres in Urban areas with a focus on slum and slum like areas are envisioned under the scheme during the period 2021-22 to 2025-26. Component wise details of physical deliverables under PM-ABHIM over five years (from 2021-22 to 2025-26) is as follows:
