CASES OF SUICIDES

542. SHRI S. VENKATESAN:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details regarding the reasons for increase in suicide cases over the last five years and data regarding the total number of cases, year-wise and State/UT-wise;
- (b) whether the Government is aware of the fact that higher number of suicide cases pertain to the age bracket of 15-29 years and if so, the details of the same during the last five years; and
- (c) the details regarding the suicide rate per one lakh of the population over the last five years?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

- (a) The reasons behind suicide vary by age, gender and educational and economic status. Suicide is not a single faceted phenomenon. The mental burden that results in suicide is often caused by multiple psychosocial factors. However, the major reasons for suicide over last 5 years has remained more or less the same with family problems and illness accounting for almost half of all the incidents of suicide. Suicides have also been attributed to other causes such as Drug abuse/addiction, marriage related issues, love affairs, failure in examination and other causes. The details, as provided by NCRB, regarding the total number of suicides committed, year-wise and State/UT-wise is enclosed at Annexure-I.
- (b) As per the information provided by NCRB, the highest number of suicide cases pertain to the age bracket of 18-29 years. The details of the age distribution of suicides for the last five years is enclosed at Annexure-II.
- (c) The details, as provided by NCRB, regarding the suicide rate per one lakh of the population over the last five years (2017-2021) is 9.9, 10.2, 10.4, 11.3 and 12.0 respectively.
