Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether as per a report, there are approximately 11.16 lakh vacant posts of teachers in the country especially in Assam, Maharashtra, Rajasthan with the rural areas having up to 69 per cent vacancies;
- (b) if so, the State-wise details, especially in Maharashtra;
- (c) the state-wise total number of female teachers in the country especially in Chatra and Latehar districts in Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Assam and Rajasthan; and
- (d) the steps taken by the Government so far to address the shortage of teachers particularly in rural areas in Jharkhand, Maharashtra including Latur Parliamentary Constituency, Assam especially Mangaldoi Parliamentary Constituency and Rajasthan including Jalore Parliamentary Constituency?

(a) to (d): The recruitment of teachers in schools is a continuous process as vacancies keep arising due to factors like retirement, resignation and additional requirements on account of enhanced students' strength/new schools. Education is in the concurrent list of the Constitution and a majority of the schools are under the administrative control of respective State and Union Territory Governments. Recruitment, service conditions and deployment of teachers primarily come under purview of the respective State and Union Territory (UT) Governments. However the Ministry of Education, from time to time, through review meetings and advisories, requests the State and UT Governments for filling up vacant posts of teachers and their rational deployment. Further, the Central Government through the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Samagra Shiksha, provides financial assistance to the States and UTs to maintain appropriate Pupil-Teacher Ratio (PTR) for various levels of schooling, as per norms prescribed in the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009, as amended from time to time. The statewise total number of female teachers in the country especially in Chatra and Latehar districts in Jharkhand is at **Annexure-A.**
