- (a) whether the Government has undertaken any survey to estimate the State-wise details of women farmers with operational holdings present in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to introduce incentive schemes for women in agricultural activities apart from Mahila Kisan Sashaktikaran Pariyojana; and
- (d) if so, the steps taken by the Government for identification of the said beneficiaries and the amount proposed to be distributed?

(a) to (d): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) TO (d) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 184 DUE FOR ANSWER ON 14TH MARCH, 2023.

- (a) & (b): As per the Agriculture Census 2015-16, the estimated number of female operational holders in the country was 2.04 crore. Number of female beneficiaries registered under Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) Scheme as on 09.03.2023 is 3.056 crore.
- (c) & (d): For gender mainstreaming and women empowerment in agriculture, Government of India has established Central Institute for Women in Agriculture (CIWA) at Bhubaneshwar, Odisha under Indian Council of Agricultural Research. The institute undertakes research on Women in Agriculture and for identifying gender issues in agriculture and allied fields, gender-equitable agricultural policies/programmes and gender-sensitive agricultural-sector responses.

The Government has set up 731 Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) in the country with mandate of technology assessment and demonstration for its application and capacity development. The KVKs impart training to women farmers on various aspects of agriculture and allied sectors. The KVKs also organize women farmer specific training programmes on various topics like household food security by kitchen gardening and nutrition gardening; Designing and development for high nutrient efficiency diet; Minimization of nutrient loss in processing; Processing and cooking; Gender mainstreaming through Self Help Groups; Storage loss minimization techniques; Rural Crafts; and Women and child care.

Government is implementing various schemes and programmes for the farmers including women farmers as per eligibility and conditions existing in scheme guidelines. Some of the major schemes include Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN), Pradhan Mantri Kisan Maandhan Yojana(PMKMY), Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY), Interest Subvention Scheme, National Food Security Mission(NFSM), Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH), Soil Health Card(SHC), Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana(RKVY), National Agriculture Market(e-NAM), Formation and Promotion of 10,000 FPOs, Mahila Kisan Sashaktikaran Pariyojana (MKSP) etc.

The schemes which provide additional support and assistance to women farmers (over and above the male farmers) are given as under:

Higher Rates of Assistance for Women under Agri-Clinic& Agri-Business Centre
 (ACABC) Scheme: Agri-Clinic & Agri-Business Centre initiative of Sub-Mission of
 Agriculture Extension provides for credit linked back-ended subsidy on the bank loan availed by
 trained candidates under the Scheme. The subsidy is 44% in respect of women, SC/ST and all

- categories of candidates from North-Eastern and Hill States and 36% in respect of other categories.
- Support for Women under Integrated Scheme of Agriculture Marketing: The support for women is available to the extent of 33.33% for women against 25% assistance available for male farmers for storage infrastructure projects and other infrastructure projects.
- Support for Women under National Food Security Mission (NFSM): 10% additional assistance is available for women under Plant Protection including eco-friendly light trap and seed treatment drum as well as supply of improved farm implements.
- Additional Financial Assistance under Sub-Mission on Agriculture Mechanization (SMAM):
 - i. 10% additional assistance is available for women under SMAM for procurement of Agriculture Machinery/Equipment including Post Harvest equipment.
 - ii. To promote use of Drones, government is providing 50% of the cost upto maximum Rs.5 Lakh Subsidy for SC/ST, Small and Marginal, women and farmers for northeastern states to buy drones and for others @ 40% of the cost upto maximum Rs. 4 Lakh.
