**Price of Commercial and Domestic LPG**

\*338. SHRI DEEPAK BAIJ:

Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) have increased the prices of commercial and domestic LPG by Rs. 350.50 and Rs. 50 per cylinder respectively from 1st March, 2023;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether there is any increase in the prices of LPG in international market during February, 2023; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof along with the price of LPG in other neighbouring countries in terms of Indian Rupee as on 1st March, 2023?

- (a) to (d):      A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

**Statement referred to in reply to parts (a) to (d) of Lok Sabha Starred Question No. 338 asked by Shri Deepak Baij to be answered on 23 March 2023 regarding “Price of Commercial and Domestic LPG”.**

(a) to (d): India imports more than 60% of its domestic LPG consumption. Government continues to modulate the effective price of domestic LPG. While the Saudi Contract Prices (CP), on which domestic LPG prices are based, rose by 235 % from 236 \$/MT in April 2020 to 790 \$/MT in February 2023, retail selling price of domestic LPG has increased only by 89.7 % from Rs.581.5 in May 2020 to Rs.1103 in March 2023 and effective cost for PMUY rose only by 55.2 % during the same period.

While for domestic LPG, Government continues to modulate the effective price to consumers, prices of commercial LPG are set by LPG marketing companies independently. Public Sector Oil Marketing Companies have suffered huge losses on sale of domestic LPG. To compensate these losses, the Government has recently paid a one-time compensation of Rs.22000 crore to OMCs. W.e.f. 21.05.2022, Government has started a targeted subsidy of Rs.200 per 14.2 Kg cylinder for Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) beneficiaries for upto 12 refills for year 2022-23.
