SCHEMES IN ODISHA

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the number of beneficiaries in Odisha under various schemes of the Government during the last three years;
- (b) the details of the financial assistance provided to Odisha under various schemes of the Government during the last three years;
- (c) whether the funds allocated to the Government of Odisha by the Union Government has been fully utilised and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the details of the schemes being run in Odisha along with the project cost, district-wise?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI PRAHLAD SINGH PATEL)

(a) Since August, 2019, Government of India in partnership with States is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) to make provision of potable tap water supply to every rural household of the country, by 2024. As reported by the State of Odisha, 3.10 lakh households were reported to have tap water connections as on 15th August 2019. Since the launch of JJM, about 47.34 lakh rural households in Odisha have been provided tap water connections. Thus, as on date, as reported by the State, provision of tap water supply has been made to 50.44 lakh (57%) households out of total 88.56 lakh rural households in Odisha.

Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM(G)] was launched by the Government on 2nd October, 2014 with the aim to make the country Open Defecation Free (ODF) by 2nd October, 2019, by providing access to toilets to all the rural households. SBM(G) Phase-II, a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, is being implemented in the rural areas in all the States/ UTs including Odisha from 2020-21 to 2024-25, with the objective to sustain the ODF status and to cover all the villages with solid and liquid waste management, i.e. to convert all the villages from ODF to ODF Plus by 2024-25. As per the data reported by the Government of Odisha on the online Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) of Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM(G)], 17.24 lakh Individual Household Latrines have been constructed in the State from 2019-20 to 2021-22.

(b) & (c) The details of central fund allocated, fund drawn by the State and reported utilization under JJM in 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 & 2022-23 are as under:
