AYURVEDA DOCTORS

†1457. SHRI OMPRAKASH BHUPALSINH *ALIAS* PAWAN RAJENIMBALKAR: SHRI ARVIND GANPAT SAWANT:

Will the Minister of **AYUSH** be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of sanctioned posts of Ayurveda doctors along with their deployment in the Primary Health Centres, State/UT-wise and category-wise;
- (b) the number of posts of the Ayurveda doctors in all categories lying vacant in the country and reasons therefor;
- (c) the number of Ayurveda doctors qualified during the last five years, State/UT-wise and year-wise;
- (d) the steps taken by the Government to fill up the vacant posts of Ayurveda doctors;
- (e) whether the Government proposes to guide the States/UTs Governments for such appointments along with the provision of financial assistance to them and if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) whether the Government has any plan to re-start integrated course in Ayurveda as well, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF AYUSH (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

- (a) The details of AYUSH doctors including Ayurveda sanctioned/deployed in the Primary Health Centres, State/UT-wise is furnished at **Annexure-I**.
- (b) to (e) As Public Health is a State subject, the primary responsibility to fill up the posts of Ayurveda doctors in all categories and maintaining their status comes under the purview of respective State/UT Governments. However, under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National AYUSH Mission (NAM), the components for setting up of upto 50/30/10 bedded integrated AYUSH hospitals and upgradation of exclusive standalone State Government AYUSH Hospitals *inter-alia* are having provision for contractual deployment of AYUSH doctors. In this regard,

State/UT Governments are required to submit their proposals through State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs) as per the guidelines of the scheme. Further, as per the data received from Board of Ethics and Registration for Indian System of Medicine (BOE&R), the list of doctors registered in the State Council/Board is furnished at **Annexure-II.**

(f) There is no such plan to re-start integrated course in Ayurveda. However, National Commission for Indian system of Medicine (NCISM) introduced AYUSH Module for MBBS, Nursing & Physiotherapy for proper orientation on the traditional medical systems i.e. Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani and Sowa-rigpa (ASUS) and get expertise as per the module.
