HEALTH ACILITIES TO TRIBAL WOMEN

1497. SHRI NABA KUMAR SARANIA:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that tribal women and children die due to malnutrition and other health-borne reasons in the country and if so, the details thereof from 2014 to till date State/UT-wise;(b) whether more tribal women die during their pregnancy and if so, the details thereof, State/UT wise, district-wise;

(c) the details of hospitals located in tribal areas, State/UT-wise;

(d) the details of various diseases affecting tribal women, State/UT-wise, district-wise; and

(e) the financial assistance granted by the Government to the pregnant women and children suffered from malnutrition during the last five years, State/UT-wise, district-wise?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (b): Malnutrition is a multi-faceted problem and is not a direct cause of Maternal death but contributes to mortality and morbidity by reducing resistance to infections.

As per the Special Bulletin on MMR released by the Registrar General of India (RGI), the Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) of India has declined to 97/lakh live birth as per Sample Registration System (SRS) from 130 in 2014-16. As per the report of Sample Registration System (SRS 18-20) released by Registrar General of India (RGI), the details of State wise Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR), including tribal areas is placed at **Annexure-1**.

As per National Family Health Surveys (NFHS) conducted by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, in respect of Scheduled Tribes, Infant Mortality Rate has declined from 62.1 (2005-06) to 41.6 (2019-21); Under Five, Mortality Rate has declined from 95.7 (2005-06) to 50.3 (2019-21), Institutional Delivery has increased from 17.7% (2005-06) to 82.3 % (2019-21) and immunization of children aged 12-23 months has increased from 31.3 % (2005-06) to 76.8 % (2019-21).

(d) The Expert Committee on Tribal Health, in its report, has stated that, tribal people face triple burden of diseases and bears a disproportionate burden of communicable diseases, primarily those that are often referred to as diseases of poverty and underdevelopment, which include Malaria, and Tuberculosis. While malnutrition and communicable diseases like malaria and tuberculosis continue to be high, rapid urbanization, environmental distress and changing lifestyle have resulted in a rise in the prevalence of non-communicable diseases like cancer, hypertension and diabetes.
