## HEALTHCARE FACILITIES IN GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS

## †1570. SHRIMATI DELKAR KALABEN MOHANBHAI:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

(a) whether there has been any improvement in the services of Government hospitals in various States/UTs in the country including Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu during the last three years;

(b) if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise;

(c) whether the Government has taken any steps for the modernization/upgradation of hospitals particularly in rural areas;

(d) if so, the details of such hospitals in Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu, areas-wise; and

(e) if not, the reasons therefor along with the State/UT-wise details thereof?

## ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) & (b) National Health Mission (NHM) envisages achievement of universal access to equitable, affordable & quality health care services that are accountable and responsive to people's needs. The healthcare system of the country involves a three-tier system with Sub Health Centre (Rural), Primary Health Centre (Urban and Rural) and Community Health Centre (Urban and Rural) as the three pillars of Primary Health Care System in India.

The details of Number of Sub-Centres, PHC, CHCs, Sub Divisional Hospitals and District Hospitals functional in rural and urban areas during the last three years including Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu is attached at **Annexure-1**.

(c) to (e) In February 2018, the Government of India announced 1,50,000 Ayushman Bharat-Health and Wellness Centres (AB-HWCs) to be established across the country by December 2022. The existing Sub- Health Centres (SHC), Primary Health Centres (PHC) and Urban Primary Health Centres (UPHC) are transformed into AB-HWCs to deliver Comprehensive Primary Health Care (CPHC) that includes preventive, promotive, curative, palliative and rehabilitative services which are universal, free, and closer to the community. As on 31.01.2023 a total of 1,56,412 AB-HWCs have been operationalized across the country. Further, details of the operationalized SHC, PHC and UPHC-HWCs, State/UTs wise as on 31.01.2023 including Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu is at **Annexure-2**.

The Government has issued various other initiatives to upgrade government hospitals in the country, including rural areas as follow:

- To improve health infrastructure and services in public health facilities, the government has laid down Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) 2022. These standards include norms for services, infrastructure, human resources, diagnostics, equipment, medicines etc.

- National Free Drugs Service Initiative and National Free Diagnostic Service Initiative have been rolled out to ensure the availability of essential drugs and diagnostic facilities and reduce the Out of Pocket Expenditure (OOPE) of the patients visiting public health facilities.

- To monitor the quality of these healthcare centres, the Government of India launched National Quality Assurance Programme (NQAS) for Public Health Facilities.

- Under National Ambulances Services for free transportation of sick patients to health facilities, BLS, ALS and PTV ambulances are being provided for the timely management of emergency services.

- People representatives are part of Rogi Kalyan Samiti and Jan Arogya Samiti at different levels of healthcare facilities so that the functionality of the facilities as per the need of the community is ensured.

- Under PM-ABHIM, So far in FY 2021-22 & FY 2022-23, administrative approval has been accorded for an amount of Rs 9,718.62 Crore for establishment/strengthening of 7808 Rural HWCs, 264 Urban HWCs, 485 BPHUs, 216 District IPHLs and 175 CCBs across States/UTs as per the proposal received.

- 157 Medical Colleges have been approved in three phases under the Scheme of 'Establishment of new Medical Colleges'

- Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY), setting up of 22 new All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) and 75 projects of upgradation of Government Medical Colleges/Institutions (GMCIs) have been approved in various phases so far.
