DIGITISATION AND LINKING OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUMS

Will the MINISTER OF **CULTURE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any scheme has been prepared regarding digitisation and linking of Archaeological museums through a single portal and if so, the details thereof and if not, the steps taken/being taken by the Government to update the records of the museums in digital format;
- (b) the number of museums that have been sanctioned for Digitisation and Development works and the status thereof,
- (c) the amount of funds released for the same, year-wise and State-wise, including Rajasthan; and
- (d) whether the Government intends to sanction any more museums and other cultural institutions for digitisation and development works and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

- (a) Yes, Sir. The National Portal and Digital Repository for Indian Museums is developed and hosted by Human Centres Design and Computing Group, C-DAC, Pune, Maharashtra as per the agreement with Ministry of Culture, Government of India
- (b) Two museums of Archaeological Survey of India i.e. Archaeological Site Museums - Nagarjunakonda Archaeological Museum Velha Goa were selected for digitization.
- (c) The amount released for digitization are:
 - 1. Nagarjunakonda Museum Rs.30,00,000/-
 - 2. Velha Goa Museum- Rs.18,70,000/- besides the cost of software which was Rs.17,60,000/-
- (d) At present, Archaeological Survey has undertaken the digitization of the museums antiquities in the standard format by National Mission for Monuments and Antiquities (N MMA).
