As per the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE) 2013-14 & Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) 2021-22, the number of Schools at Secondary & Higher Secondary level has increased from 1,41,941 to 1,50,452 & from 86,261 to 1,42,398 respectively from 2013-14 to 2021-22.
