NEW NATIONAL TOURISM POLICY

- (a) to (b): Ministry of Tourism has drafted a new National Tourism Policy after situational analysis including the impact of COVID-19 and taking into account future projections for the tourism sector with a vision for India@100. The key strategic objectives of the draft policy are:
- i. To enhance the contribution of tourism in Indian economy by increasing the visitation, stay and spend and making India a year-round tourist destination,
- ii. To create jobs and entrepreneurial opportunities in tourism sector and ensure supply of skilled work force,

- iii. To enhance the competitiveness of tourism sector and attract private sector investment,
- iv. To preserve and enhance the cultural and natural resources of the country,
- v. To ensure sustainable, responsible and inclusive development of tourism in the country.

The draft National Tourism Policy was circulated for inter-ministerial consultation. The draft National Tourism Policy is at a consultation stage after consideration and incorporation of the feedback/comments received from the relevant stakeholders.
