Retention Rate of Students in Schools

2015. SHRI ANUBHAV MOHANTY:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the general retention rate of students in Government schools, at the primary, elementary, secondary and higher secondary levels, State-wise;
- (b) whether the Government maintains information and data on the rate of drop-outs among children belonging to weaker sections and disadvantaged groups admitted under Section 12(1) (c) of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009;
- (c) if not, the details thereof;
- (d) the retention rate of children with disabilities, at the primary, elementary, secondary and higher secondary levels, State-wise; and
- (e) the retention rate of children belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, at the primary, elementary, secondary and higher secondary levels, State-wise?

ANSWER

- (a): The Department of School Education and Literacy (DoSEL), Ministry of Education has developed the Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) system to record data on indicators of school education provided by all the States and Union Territories. As per UDISE+, the retention rate for 2021-22 of primary, elementary, secondary and higher secondary levels, State—wise is at Annexure-I.
- (b) and (c): As per UDISE+ 2021-22, dropout rate for primary and upper primary levels for children belonging to different social groups is given below.

(d) and (e): The Retention rate of students is calculated gender-wise for the different levels of school education. Improving retention rate of students in school is a continuous process. Government of India launched Samagra Shiksha - an Integrated Scheme for school education, w.e.f. 2018-19, as an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school to class XII and aims to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education at all levels of school education.

Further, in order to improve the education standard, the Government has taken several steps:-

- 1. Central RTE Rules have been amended on 20th February, 2017 to include reference on class-wise, subject-wise Learning Outcomes at Elementary level.
- 2. National Achievement Survey (NAS) is conducted to enable States/UTs to identify gaps in learning outcomes.
- 3. A 70 indicator based matrix Performance Grading Index (PGI) has been developed to grade the States/UTs. Also, an 83 indicator based matrix Performance Grading Index for Districts (PGI-D) has been developed to grade the Districts.
- 4. NISHTHA (National Initiative for School Heads and Teachers Holistic Advancement), an Integrated Teacher Training Programme has been introduced.
