Will the Minister of **FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING** मत्स्य पालन, पशु पालन और डेयरी मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the salient features of the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY);
- (b) whether the Government has granted any funds under the said Yojana;
- (c) if so, the details of the funds sanctioned, allocated and utilized thereunder, if not, the reasons therefor during each of the last five years and the current year, State-wise including Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Tamil Nadu and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (d) the number of beneficiaries, State and district-wise including Tamil Nadu;
- (e) the details of the target set and achievements made in terms of production, productivity and export of fishery products so far along with its positive response in the country, State-wise including Andhra Pradesh;
- (f) whether it is upto the set target, if so, the details thereof and if not, the steps being taken by the Government to achieve the target;
- (g) whether the Government is planning to implement a sub-scheme of this yojana to support fishermen and fish vendors across the country, if so, the details thereof and the funds likely to be sanctioned under this sub-scheme; and
- (h) the time by which it is likely to be implemented in the country?

**ANSWER**

**THE MINISTER OF FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING:**

**(SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)**

(a): The Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana has been approved at a total estimated investment of Rs. 20,050 crore under Atma Nirbhar Bharat Package for a period of 5 years from 2020-21 to 2024-25. The PMMSY is an umbrella scheme with two separate components namely (a) Central Sector Scheme (CS) component and (b) Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) component. The Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) Component is further segregated into Non-beneficiary oriented and beneficiary orientated subcomponents/activities under the three broad heads namely, (i) Enhancement of Production and Productivity, (ii) Infrastructure and Post-harvest Management and (iii) Fisheries Management and Regulatory Framework. The PMMSY is designed to address critical gaps in fish production and productivity, quality, technology, post-harvest infrastructure and management, modernisation and strengthening of value chain, traceability, establishing a robust fisheries management framework and fishers' welfare.

(b) to (d) : The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying under “Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY)” during the last two financial years (2020-21 and 2021-22) and the current financial year (2022-23) has accorded approvals to the proposals of thirty five States/Union Territories and other Implementing agencies amounting to Rs. 12035.07crore with central share of Rs. 4536.36 crore and out of which central funds of Rs. 2103.42 crore has been released to various States/UTs and other implementing agencies during the above said period for utilization. State-wise including Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Tamil Nadu details of projects approved, central funds sanctioned and fund released for utilization are furnished at Annexure-I. State-wise estimated beneficiaries benefitted under PMMSY including district-wise beneficiaries covered in the State of Tamil Nadu are furnished respectively at Annexure-II and Annexure-III.

(e) and (f) :PMMSY inter-alia targets for increasing the additional fish production of 70 lakh tone, double export earnings to about one lakh crore and enhancing productivity in aquaculture from the national average of 3 tonne to about 5 tonne per hectare by the year 2024-25. The overall fish production in the country reached an all-time high at 162.48 lakh tonne in 2021-22 from 141.64 lakh tonne in 2019-20 recording a cumulative growth of 14.72% during the last three years. The export earnings from fisheries has registered at Rs.57,586.48 crore in 2021-22 from Rs 46,662 crore during 2019-20.

(g) and (h) :Yes Sir. The Union Government in the budget 2023-24 has announced a new sub-scheme of Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana with a targeted investment of Rs 6,000 crore to further enable activities of fishermen, fish vendors and micro and small enterprises, improve value chain efficiencies and expand the market.
