Will the Minister of FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING मत्स्यपालन, पशुपालनऔरडेयरीमंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government focuses on development of dairy entrepreneurship to promote Dairy Entrepreneurship Development Scheme (DEDS) and employment generation in animal husbandry and dairy industries in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the measures taken by the Government to promote Dairy Entrepreneurship Development Scheme and Employment Generation Scheme for the development of animal husbandry and dairy industries in the country;
- (c) the number of entrepreneurs who have availed the benefits of this opportunity during the last three years, State-wise including Maharashtra; and
- (d) the details of the financial assistance provided under the scheme and the progress made thereunder as on date?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER FOR FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING (SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)

(a) & (b) Dairy Entrepreneurship Development Scheme (DEDS) was implemented by Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Government of India through National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) from September 2010 to March 2020.

To support dairy entrepreneurship, the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying has initiated Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund with a scheme outlay of Rs.15000 crore under Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan stimulus package for incentivizing the (i) the dairy processing and value addition infrastructure, (ii) meat processing and value addition infrastructure (iii) Animal Feed Plant (iv) Breed improvement technology and Breed multiplication farm (v) Setting up of veterinary vaccine and drugs production facilities and (vi) Animal waste of wealth management (Agri waste management).

In addition, National Livestock Mission (NLM) also aims towards employment generation through entrepreneurship development in small ruminant, poultry, piggery and Fodder sector. Further, Rashtriya Gokul Mission scheme also has a component in support of breeder farms to be set up by entrepreneurs.

- (c) State-wise number of beneficiaries and back-ended subsidy disbursed by NABARD under DEDS including in the State of Maharashtra during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 are given at **Annexure.**
- (d) A total amount of Rs.1892.29 crore was disbursed as back ended subsidy to 4,21,164 beneficiaries in the country under DEDS.
