Will the Minister of MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) the district-wise details of the amount received under District Mineral Foundation Trust (DMFT) by Jharkhand during the last two years;
- (b) the guidelines regarding the utilisation of the said amount the sectors and the nature of the works in which the said amount is likely to be spent;
- (c) the provisions for spending the amount allocated under DMFT;
- (d) the amount spent in Jharkhand so far during the year 2022-23, district-wise; and
- (e) the details of the works completed during the year 2022-23 under DMFT in Ranchi?

## THE MINISTER OF MINES, COAL AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI PRALHAD JOSHI)

- (a): Information is provided in Annexure I.
- (b) to (e): Ministry of Mines has circulated guidelines for Pradhan Mantri Khanij Kshetra Kalyan Yojna (PMKKKY) on 16.09.2015 to be implemented by the District Mineral Foundations (DMF) for taking up development and welfare projects/programs in mining affected areas. As per PMKKKY guidelines, at least 60% of the funds are to be spent on High Priority areas and up to 40% of the funds are to be spent on other priority areas. Further, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 9B, Section 15(4) and Section 15A of the MMDR Act, 1957, Government of Jharkhand has notified Jharkhand District Mineral (Trust) Rules, 2016, which, *inter-alia*, prescribes the composition and function of DMF, manner in which DMF shall work and procedure of utilization of funds under DMFs.

Information on amount spent in Jharkhand so far during the year 2022-23, district-wise is provided in Annexure II and details of the works completed during the year 2022-23 under DMFT in Ranchi is provided in Annexure III.
