FLIGHTS FROM SURAT AIRPORT

2546. SHRI C.R. PATIL Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION

- (a) the details of the flights operational from Surat Airport, flight/airline-wise during the last three years and current year;
- (b) whether it is a fact that the number of flights from Surat airport to national and international destination have been reduced, and if so, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government has initiated steps to increase the number of flights from Surat airport; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): Ministry of Civil Aviation continues to interact with the airlines to promote air connectivity in the country. The details of airline-wise scheduled flights from Surat Airport during the last three years and current year is attached as Annexure - I.

With the repeal of the Air Corporation Act in March 1994, the Indian domestic aviation market has been deregulated. Consequently, for commercial flight operations, airlines are free to induct capacity with any aircraft type for selecting whatever markets and networks they wish to operate across the country. Thus, it is up to the airlines to provide air services to specific places depending upon the traffic demand and their commercial viability, in compliance with the extant guidelines in this regard.
