(d) whether the Government proposes to increase the number of Flight Training Programme; and

(b) As per Airports Authority of India (AAI), growth of AAI airports expected in last 5 years is as follows:-;

(c) Currently, there are 08 Flying Training Centres in Maharashtra.

Currently, there are no Flying Training Centres in West Bengal; ;

(d) and (e) In order to set up more flying training institutes in the country, in 2021, after a competitive bidding process, AAI awarded nine FTO slots at five airports at Belagavi (Karnataka), Jalgaon (Maharashtra), Kalaburagi (Karnataka), Khajuraho (Madhya Pradesh) and Lilabari (Assam).;

In June 2022, under second round of bidding, six FTO slots were awarded by AAI at five airports namely: two slots at Bhavnagar (Gujarat), and one each at Hubballi (Karnataka), Kadappa (Andhra Pradesh), Kishangarh (Rajasthan) and Salem (Tamil Nadu).
