RISING CASES OF DIABETES

2872. SHRI HASNAIN MASOODI:

Will the **MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the alarming increase in type-1 and type-2 diabetes cases has resulted in a rise in Chronic Kidney Disease across the country, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the number of dialysis-dependent patients in the country with State-wise break up including Jammu and Kashmir.
- (c) whether the dialysis facilities are available in all the district and sub-district hospitals of Jammu and Kashmir and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) if not, the timeframe fixed for setting up of aforesaid facilities at the Sub-District level?

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE
(DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)**

(a): Diabetes is the one of the leading most common risk factors for Chronic Kidney Diseases (CKDs). Type 2 Diabetes is more common risk factor than Type 1 Diabetes. It is responsible for 35 – 40% of CKD patients.

(b) to (d): Under Pradhan Mantri National Dialysis Programme (PMNDP), approximately 3.5 lakhs patients receive dialysis annually in the country.

The objective of the PMNDP is to ensure availability of dialysis services in all the district hospitals in the country. On achieving 100% coverage of districts in the country, the dialysis services can be established at the SDH/CHCs.
