Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- a) the number of persons reported to be suffering from Measles and Rubella (MR) in the country during last three years, State/UT-wise;
- b) the necessary steps taken by the Government to eliminate MR completely from the country;
- c) whether the Government proposes to extend the deadline to completely eradicate MR from the country and if so, the details thereof; and
- d) the total funds released by the Government for the elimination of MR during each of the last three years and the current year and the actual amount spent thereupon?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (d): The details of the cases reported from Measles and Rubella during the last three years is at Annexure.

Government has taken several steps to eliminate Measles and rubella by 2023. These include:

i. Roadmap for Measles and Rubella (MR) Elimination has been prepared and disseminated to the States and UTs across India which serves as a guidance tool for States/Districts for planning the MR elimination activities including strengthening of Measles and Rubella vaccine coverage and surveillance.

- A special advisory was issued to all States/UTs on 23rd November, 2022 detailing the actions to be taken to curtail morbidity and mortality due to Measles outbreak.
- iii. States/UTs reporting Measles outbreaks have been advised to conduct Outbreak Response Immunization to limit the occurrence of outbreaks.
- iv. Communications have been issued to States/UTs highlighting the progress made towards achieving MR elimination.

Union Health Ministry provides financial assistance to States/UTs for strengthening of health infrastructure. Under National Health Mission (NHM) funds are released to States/UTs under flexible pools on a lump sum basis providing greater flexibility to States/UTs to utilize the funds as per their felt need and priorities as approved under (Programme Implementation Plan) PIP of National Health Mission.
