TREATMENT OF HEPATITIS B

+2942. SHRI ANIL FIROJIYA:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of patients suffering from Hepatitis B in the country;
- (b) whether the patients suffering from Hepatitis B are likely to be cured completely and if so, the details thereof:
- (c) the details of treatment available for patients suffering from Hepatitis B in the country;
- (d) the details of locations in the country where the treatment of Hepatitis B is available in the country; and
- (e) the necessary steps taken/being taken by the Government to prevent the said disease in the country?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

- (a) The number of persons suffering from Hepatitis B in the country under the National Viral Hepatitis Control Program (NVHCP) is around 3,03,700 out of 3,89,41,800 screened.
- (b) Majority of the patients suffering from chronic Hepatitis B are not cured completely. Complications in chronic hepatitis B patients can be prevented by treatment.

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- (c) There are three treatment regimens available under NVHCP as mentioned below:-
 - (i) Tab Tenofovir Disoproxil Fumarate (TDF) 300 mg once daily,
 - (ii) Tab Entecavir 0.5 mg once daily,
 - (iii) Tab Entecavir 1 mg once daily.
- (d) The State/UT-wise details of NVHCP Model Treatment Centre (Referral Site) and Treatment Centre locations in the country for management of Hepatitis B are **annexed**.
- (e) The necessary steps taken by the Government to prevent the said disease in the country are mentioned below:-

Prevention of transmission of Hepatitis B virus from mother-to-child:

India has already included vaccine against Hepatitis B under the universal immunization program. The program advocates for screening of all pregnant women for Hepatitis B during their antenatal care check-ups to ensure that the newborn, who are born to Hepatitis B infected mother receives birth dose vaccination for Hepatitis B along with Hepatitis B Immunoglobulin (HBIG) within 24 hours of birth.

Prevention of Hepatitis B in Healthcare workers:

Vaccination against Hepatitis B to the healthcare workers is provided as per the requirement of the States/UTs.
