BUDGET ALLOCATION IN HEALTH SECTOR

Will the **Minister of HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is an increase of 3.82 per cent in budget allocation to health sector for 2023-24 as compared to 2022-23;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of actual allocation made in health sector during the previous and the current financial year; and
- (d) whether the Government proposes to set up Medical Colleges in each district of the country and if so, the details of such a proposal?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (c)

For the Department of Health and Family Welfare, the allocation of Rs. 86175.00 Crore in the Budget Estimate (BE) 2023-24 is higher by 3.83% visa-vis Rs. 83000.00 Crore allocated in BE 2022-23. Further, BE 2023-24 is higher by 12.84% vis-a-vis Revised Estimate (RE) 2022-23 of Rs. 76370.40 Crore.

(d) The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare administers a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for 'Establishment of new Medical Colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals' with preference to underserved areas and aspirational districts, where there is no existing Government or private medical college. Under the Scheme, a total of 157 medical colleges have been sanctioned in three phases with fund sharing between the Centre and State Governments in the ratio of 90:10 for North Eastern and Special Category States and 60:40 for others. Out of these, 97 Medical colleges are functional till now. The planning, execution and commissioning of the projects are to be done by the respective State/UT Government, being the implementing agency.
