Progress of JJM

3772. SHRI PARTHIBAN S.R.:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the progress made so far under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) towards achieving the objective to enable every rural household with assured and clean water supply through functional household tap connections by 2024, State/UT-wise;
- (b) the details of the villages having functional village water and sanitation facility in the State of Tamil Nadu;
- (c) whether the Government has any proposal to modify the guidelines for ensuring effective implementation of JJM; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI

(a) At the time of announcement of Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) on 15th August, 2019, 3.23 crore (16.66%) rural households had potable tap water supply. As on date, 11.49 Crore (59.15%) rural households have provision of potable tap water supply. The State-wise progress under JJM is annexed.

(b) Tamil Nadu has reported that all 12,525 villages (100%) in the State have piped water supply. Further, as on 20.03.2023, 2,279 villages are reported as 'Har Ghar Jal' i.e. 100 % households of these villages have individual tap connection. Regarding sanitation, as reported, 11,983 villages are ODF (Open Defecation Free) plus, out of which 11,917 villages are ODF plus aspiring villages, 46 are ODF plus rising villages, and 20 are ODF plus model villages. Details of these villages are available in public domain at:

(c) & (d) To achieve the goal of JJM in the whole country with speed and scale, Operational guidelines for the implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission – Har Ghar Jal were firmed up in consultation with State Governments and other stakeholders working in water sector and the same was shared with States. Further, Government of India is handholding the States through number of steps inter alia, which includes joint discussion and finalization of annual action plan (AAP) of States/ UTs regular review of implementation, workshops/ conferences/ webinars for capacity building and knowledge sharing, field visits by multi-disciplinary teams and National WASH experts, to provide technical support, etc. Moreover, as per feedback received from the States/ UTs through regular reviews & follow-ups and to address the problems being faced by the State implementing agencies, necessary amendments are made in the operational guidelines, from time to time.
