PROTECTION OF ELECTRONIC ITEMS AT AIRPORTS

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION नागर विमानन मंत्री

be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether the Government has taken note of the need to address the issue of passengers misplacing their electronic items during security checks around rush hours;
- (b) if so, the details of the steps taken/proposed to be taken to address the same and if not, reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government is aware of the limitations of having X-ray scanners, especially leading to an increased waiting time for hand luggage; and
- (d) If so, the details of the manner in which the said process is being made/proposed to be made less time consuming and if not, reasons therefor?

ANSWER

- (a) & (b): Yes, Sir. Airports are equipped with robust CCTV surveillance network which is monitored by CISF. This helps tracking misplaced items. Also, there is Lost and Found system in place at the airports to extend support to passengers misplacing any item including electronic items during security checks.
- (c) & (d): In order to address the issue of time taken at security check, the number of X-ray machines are increased based on passenger load. To make passenger aware on security restricted items, proper signages are also put in place at airports.
