Will the Minister of **EDUCATION** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has details of funds disbursed under the National Scheme for incentive to girls education during last five years;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, year-wise and State-wise specially in Uttar Pradesh;
- (c) whether the Government has stopped giving assistance under this scheme anytime in the last five years;
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether the Government will reintroduce the scheme by increasing the amount given to every student, this financial year; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof, if not, the reasons therefor?

(a): The National Scheme of Incentive to Girls for Secondary Education (NSIGSE) scheme has been discontinued w.e.f. the year 2018-19 due to inherent issues in the design and implementation of the scheme. Through the Samagra Shiksha Scheme, the Ministry now provides for several interventions for the girl child. The details of the funds disbursed under NSIGSE in last five years are as follows:

(b) Year wise & State wise funds allocated, sanctioned under National Scheme of Incentive to Girls for Secondary Education (NSIGSE) Uttar Pradesh State is at Annexure.-I.

(c) to (f): The NSIGSE scheme has been discontinued w.e.f. the year 2018-19 due to inherent issues in the design and implementation of the scheme. However, this Ministry remains strongly committed to the education of girl child, specially those belonging to SC and ST and other disadvantaged groups. Education of girl child is a critical component in various interventions of the Department of School Education and Literacy. Several measures for education of girls are being implemented through the flagship scheme of Samagra Shiksha being operated by this Department which has a financial commitment of Rs. 11040.61 Crore and Rs. 12964.85 Crore for FY 2021-22 and for FY 2022-23 respectively as follows:-
